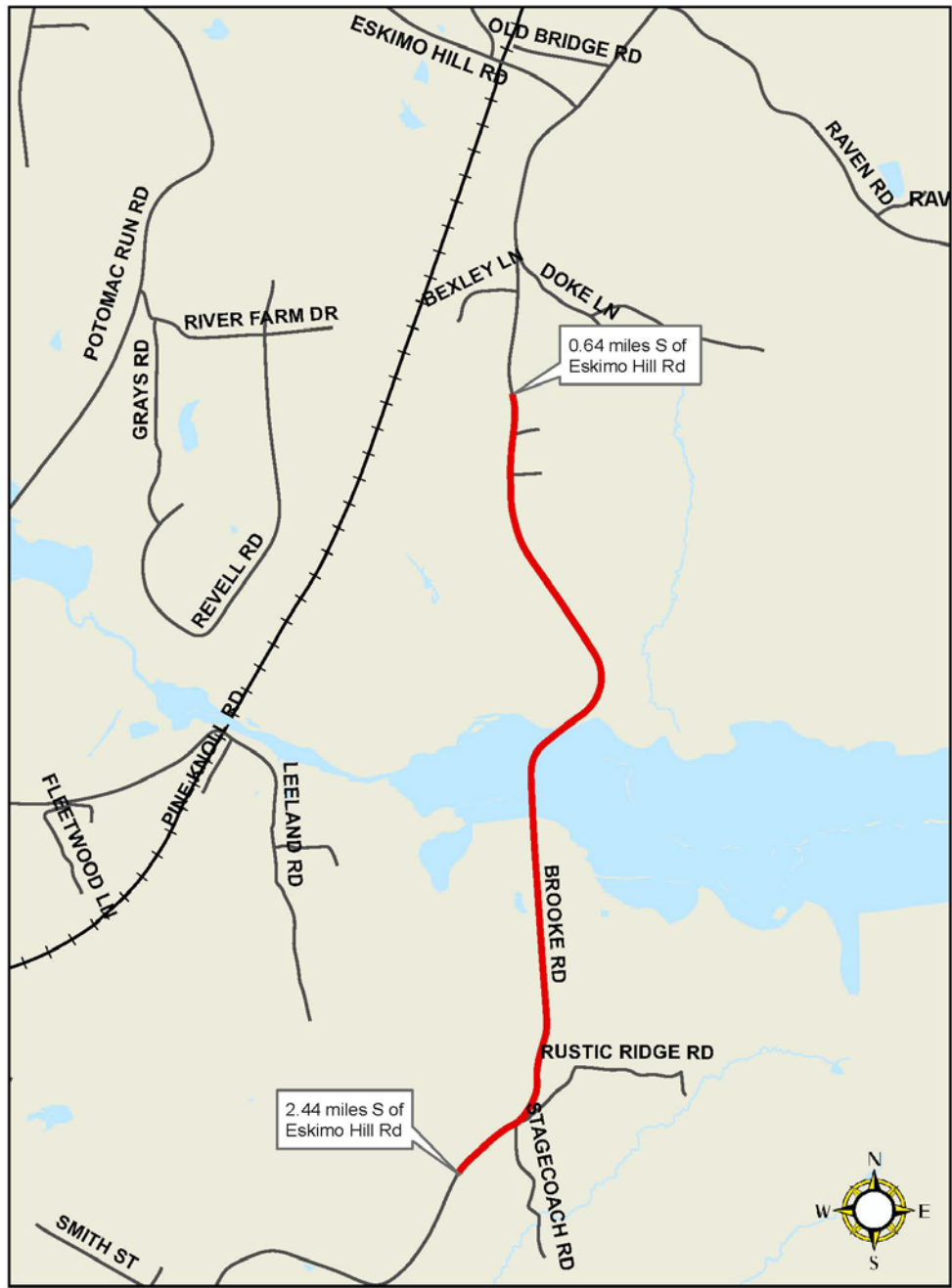

Project Overview

- The Brooke Road Improvement Project seeks to improve the safety of Brooke Road by providing wider travel lanes, graded shoulders, new ditches to improve drainage, and flatter horizontal and vertical curves.
- Project Limits are from approximately 1000' south of the intersection with Stagecoach & Rustic Ridge Road to 0.6 miles south of the intersection with Eskimo Hill Road.
- Project length is approximately 1.8 miles
- Project construction cost is approximately \$5.2 million
- Scheduled construction completion date is March 16, 2020.

Construction Impacts

- Lane Closures Allowed:
 - Monday – Friday → 9:00 AM to 7:00 PM
 - Saturday → All Day
 - Sunday → None
 - Contractor will maintain at least one travel lane at all times during the day
 - Contractor will maintain access to all businesses and residences during construction
- Contractor will reconstruct one lane while traffic travels on the adjacent lane. Be prepared for shifts in traffic.



Construction Impacts

- A Detour and Road Closure will be necessary to extend existing culverts underneath the road.
- Portable Message Signs will be installed at least 1 week prior to the closure and detour signs will direct traffic around the detour.
- Residents will still be able to access their homes
- Detoured motorists will need to follow signs, taking a route along Deacon Road to Leeland Road and onto Potomac Run Road and Eskimo Hill Road to bypass the road closure.
